


Blackman. My cape is black and blue. I want a symbol on my






I liked the Gerbil Wheel because it was fun and stuff and because I like to run. I liked the rocket laser because I could see other things.

For our first service learning activity, we gave back to the pet therapy dogs and their owners who visit us once a month for "Read to a Dog." Every month, a group of people bring their registered pet therapy dogs to Odyssey Explorers. The youth choose a book or two and cuddle up to a dog to read aloud. It's a relaxing way to practice reading – the dogs are nonjudgmental and LOVE the attention, and the children feel free to plow ahead and read material even when it is challenging!



To thank them, we made tieblankets out of flannel for the dogs. The blankets require cutting two equal size squares of flannel, cutting strips of the cloth around the edges and then tying them together. It makes a cozy warm place for the dogs to snuggle.

For our second service learning project, we made Valentine's cards and goodie packets for veterans who are in transitional housing in Madison. These veterans returned from service with physical and

emotional problems and have faced homelessness, drug addiction, depression and more. The home provides a safe place for them to heal and develop coping, human relation and employment skills.


We used donated items and a few purchased items to make up packets of materials they need: pencil holders, pens, pencils, eraser, note cards, stamps, sticky notes, plus some snacks and chocolate. Each veteran also received a Valentine's card from one of the children.

and I help her when she is hurt. We both have a dog and we have glasses. That is why we are best friends.



Seals on the Bus Rap


The seals on the bus are sayin' erp today,
