


I would love to be in Odyssey again for the second semester as this class will forever be the foundation to my education. My journey has begun, and to you, Professor Emily, I give you the

thought that this was just "school" and I would have "teachers." Boy, was I fooled! What I got instead was a wonderful team of inspirational


