I liked the book about ducklings. **(Kayd)**






My favorite part of Odyssey Junior was making new friends. (Cookie)

history through the book Stamped and I also enjoyed learning about women's history which, like black history, isn't represented much at school. However,





I can read. I can also flip and bounce on my trampoline. I like to swing. One day, I went so high I hit my head on a tree branch. (Kayd)




I learned how to be more respectful and adaptable to my changing environment. I've learned how to make different beats for the class soundtrack. (Langston)

We learned how to take care of our chickens, Frank and




I learned how to write and spell my name. I know letters and the sounds they make. I learned about other kids

This year I learned how to knit. (Antoine)


I learned to wash my hands all of the time. (Antonio)



I have learned how to high five and try new foods. I want to be as big as my big bros. (Harrison)




I learned to walk when I turned 9 months old this year. (A'khi)

I'd like to be a chef when I grow up. (Jayvon)


This year, I raised my GPA to 3.0 in virtual school. My goal is to have more time to keep getting better grades. (Michael)
